In the heart of Southern California, the Rincon Band of Luiseño Indians has thrived for generations, preserving their rich culture and heritage. Embracing Zero Trust

With this vision in mind, the Rincon band took a decisive step toward implementing a Zero Trust policy, meaning that no one inside or outside the organization is trusted by default. Every access request is verified, ensuring that only legitimate users gain entry to sensitive areas and data.

This philosophy resonated deeply with the tribe's commitment to maintaining their cultural integrity. By adopting Zero Trust, they could mitigate the risks associated with unauthorized access and cyber threats, protecting not just their physical sites but the very essence of their community. Moreover, this security framework would pave the way for greater collaboration with other tribal nations and federal agencies, enhancing their ability to work together on shared goals.
